Effective Friday, June 12, 2020 all Iberia Parish Libraries will reopen to the public, in accordance with saftey regulations. All branches will be resuming regular business hours. Library staff will remain available for questions via phone, email and the library social media accounts, and the textal-librarian service. The text-a-librarian service can be accessed by texting AskIPL to 66746, message and data rates do apply.

Please review the following information regarding reopening:

- For the safety of the public and our staff, we encourage that the public please wear a face mask/ covering when inside our brances as our staff will be doing the same.
- All library branches will be opened at 50% capacity. You may be asked to wait before entering the building in order for our staff to regulate the 50% capacity limit.
- There will be a limited amount of public computers available at each branch to better adhere to the social distancing recommendations.
- Meeting rooms will be unavailable for booking at this time in order to better regulate the 50% capacity limit and to ensure adherence to the social distancing regulations.
- Programs and events will remain online/virtual until further notice to adhere to saftey and social distancing recommendations.
- Until further notice we will not be accepting donations of any kind at any of our branch locations.

Fines and late fees incurred starting Friday, June 12th will no longer be waived. Patrons will be held responsible for these fines and late fees. We ask that you please return any checked-out materials that were held since March 18 at your earliest convenience. All book drop boxes will be open for drop-off.

We continue to urge the public to utilize the free online eResources available through the library's website. Almost all online resources can be accessed from home with your Iberia Parish Library card. For eBook, audiobook and magazine checkouts, please visit Flipster, Overdrive and/or the Libby app. Students have access to educational online databases and websites like Vidcode, where they can learn the basics of coding and computer science.
